#### **IMPACTING 3,000 SCHOOLS & CREATING THOUSANDS OF JOBS**

Inspired by the Summit, Pastor Dennis Baril and Community Covenant Church (CCC) in Rehoboth, Massachusetts, are having massive impact in Haiti.

- As the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, Haiti is in need of change—and hope. In conjunction with Willow Creek Association, CCC assisted the Haitian community in hosting the GLS. By bringing leadership development to leaders throughout society leaders are finding real solutions to the poverty, education, and spiritual darkness that have infiltrated this country.
- Teachers in Haiti wrestle with poverty, a lack of educational resources, and outdated curriculumall of which limit their effectiveness in the classroom. Inspired by the GLS, teachers in Rehoboth developed the Teachers Training Teachers Program (TTT) with a vision to improve Haiti's educational environment. TTT enhances curriculum and fosters the professional development of teachers in 3.000 Haitian schools.
- Community Covenant Church has built a solid relationship with a multi-national corporation that could create as many as 15,000 jobs for Haitians, giving them hope and a road out of poverty.

## THE GLOBAL LEADERSHIP SUMMIT ... CHANGING THE OUTCOME

#### **GROWING CHALLENGES IN ZIMBABWE RESPOND TO** LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

In a sold-out venue in Harare, Zimbabwe, the GLS sessions challenged and encouraged leaders to courageously follow God's call in their lives. Recognizing that leading well is essential in the face of growing challenges:

- One newly elected parliamentarian asked the Harare GLS team to lead his parliamentary team through the GLS content.
- A local pastor is gathering intergenerational pastors in order to implement a mentorship program that will impact the next generation of leaders.
- Hunger for leadership training has moved the GLS team to establish monthly breakfasts where leaders can discuss individual sessions in depth

### **REACHING EVERY WOMAN** IN PAKISTAN

For the majority of Christians in Pakistan, simply being known as a Christian poses a risk to their safety, let alone attending an event like the GLS. But courageous Christian leaders in this part of the world do not let fear and opposition squelch their hunger to grow in Christeven when it could cost them their lives. Moved by the GLS, one woman began an 11-month leadership training program—for women. With a vision to reach every woman in Pakistan with the gospel of Jesus Christ, teaching them to read, write, and lead, this program is the first of its kind in the history of the church in this country. Despite the extreme risk, 22 women graduated in 2013. Sixty additional women have enrolled for 2014, eager to learn from GLS faculty.

#### THE GIRL IN THE YELLOW DRESS

When filmmaker Richard Curtis, known for box office hits like Nottinghill and Love Actually, spoke at the Summit, he had no idea the impact he would make on the lives of orphans in desperate need of hope. Curtis' short film about a homeless girl in a yellow dress so deeply moved Pastor Brain Hopkins at Journey Church in Bozeman, Montana, that he traveled to Ethiopia with the idea that perhaps his church could sponsor a school. God had other plans When Brian visited a local orphanage, he sensed an undeniable prompting to adopt three children who joined the four kids he and his wife already had. In the months that followed, more than 13 families at Journey Church welcomed children into their families and adoption is now part of the fabric of their church...all because God used a two-minute video at the Summit.
